He has almost thirty years' experience of working in and for businesses of all sizes, across almost every sector, developing and implementing waste minimisation, circular economy business plans, resource and energy efficiency programmes, environmental management systems and, of course, carbon foot-printing. He has also worked as an Eco-homes assessor, and delivered projects for UK government in energy efficiency, net zero retrofit and supply chain sustainability.


David has held a number of senior management roles across a range of public and private sector clients, delivering complex business and technology-led change programmes. He has worked across the ICT, finance and energy sectors.
